Media Release: Diocese of Wagga Wagga History Book – Consider the Crows

A book chronicling the people, events and situations which have shaped the Catholic Diocese of Wagga Wagga has been officially released.

Written by Father Justin Darlow, *Consider the Crows* is a comprehensive history of the diocese, from its establishment in 1917 to the present day.

Originally commissioned to celebrate the centenary in 2017, it focuses on the diocese's growth and development in a way that readers will find both informative and enjoyable.

The work depends solidly on primary source material and has been divided into chapters that correspond to the episcopates of the successive bishops.

This history brings many strands together including stories of influential laypeople, clergy and religious, the changing demographics of this beautiful part of the country, and important events – all presented in the context of the changes in the wider local society and in the world generally.
